During this season of Advent the Church reminds us of a significant scripture quote for this sacred season: "Give comfort to my people, says your God." This Advent season we invite you to give comfort to the people of South Sudan, the newest country in our world.

The people of South Sudan are suffering greatly because of an ongoing war. Since the conflict 3.6 million citizens have been forced to flee their homes and more than 2.1 million are trapped inside the warring nation.

Over 5.1 million people are in need of aid, and 4.8 million are facing hunger. Due to economic collapse and three years of poor agricultural conditions, areas of South Sudan are now experiencing famine.

Friends in Solidarity, Inc. is an organization that is trying to bring hope to the South Sudanese people through education, health care, peace studies and an agriculture program.

We are offering this Advent calendar as a way for you to learn about, pray for and offer a donation to help the South Sudanese people. Before the first day of Advent (Dec. 2) find a container you can use to collect your donations.

Use this calendar to complete the action for each day. On Christmas Day, count your donations and send a check to *Friends in Solidarity*. Your Christmas gift will be a blessing to the people of South Sudan.

	chance of dying in child birth than of graduating from secondary school. As we focus on Mary during this Advent season pray for the women and girls who are pregnant in South Sudan.
Wednesday December 12	\$110 million dollars is needed to fully respond to the health needs of the Sudanese people. Thank God for your health and contribute \$1.10 to assist the people of South Sudan.
Thursday December 13	In 2016 there were 1.3 million cases of malaria reported in South Sudan (WHO). Malaria is a life-threatening disease. Pray for all those who are suffering from Malaria. Thank God again for your good health and access to health care.
Friday December 14	National Immunization Days in March aimed to reach over 3 million children under 5 with two drops of polio vaccine (WHO). South Sudan has been polio free for the last 7 years. Contribute 50 cents for this good news and ask a triend to match it.
Saturday December 15	The Catholic Health Training Institute in Wau is one of few centers in South Sudan training registered nurses and midwives. Make a generous donation to Friends in Solidarity to support these future nurses.
Sunday December 16	Today's scripture reading reminds us to "rejoice always" because "God is near". God is near to the people of South Sudan through organizations like Friends in Solidarity and supporters like you. Today consider all the ways God has brought joy to your life and make a contribution that will bring joy to the South Sudanese people.
