During this season of Advent the Church reminds us of a significant scripture quote for this sacred season: "Give comfort to my people, says your God." This Advent season we invite you to give comfort to the people of South Sudan, the newest country in our world.

The people of South Sudan are suffering greatly because of an ongoing war. Since the conflict 3.6 million citizens have been forced to flee their homes and more than 2.1 million are trapped inside the warring nation.

Over 5.1 million people are in need of aid, and 4.8 million are facing hunger. Due to economic collapse and three years of poor agricultural conditions, areas of South Sudan are now experiencing famine.

Friends in Solidarity, Inc. is an organization that is trying to bring hope to the South Sudanese people through education, health care, peace studies and an agriculture program.

We are offering this Advent calendar as a way for you to learn about, pray for and offer a donation to help the South Sudanese people. Before the first day of Advent (Dec. 1) find a container you can use to collect your donations.

Use this calendar to complete the action for each day. On December 24th, count your donations and send a check to **Friends in Solidarity**. Your Christmas gift will be a blessing to the people of South Sudan.

	In South Sudan only 30% of Primary
December 9	school teachers are trained and only 66% of Secondary School teachers. Only 4% have at least a secondary education. (UNICEF) Contribute 10 cents for every year of your education.
December 10	Solidarity Teaching Training College helps to train teachers for the children in South Sudan. Who was your favorite teacher? Pray for him/her for working so hard to give you an education. In honor of this favorite teacher make a
	generous donation to Friends in Solidarity to support the teacher training program.
December 11	The pupil/teacher ratio in South Sudan is 50:1 (Girls Education in South Sudan) and the ratio of children to classroom is over 100. (UNICEF) Ask a child or grandchild about their class size. Contribute 5 cents for each student in this child's class.
December 12	Over 4000 teachers have participated in courses offered through the Solidarity Teacher Training Program. Pray for the continued success of this program and all the donors who have made this program possible.
December 13	National Immunization Days in March aimed to reach over 3 million children under 5 with two drops of polio vaccine (WHO). South Sudan has been polio free for the last 8 years. Contribute 50 cents for this good news and ask a friend to match it.
December 14	1 in 3 people in South Sudan have been displaced. Imagine what it would be like to leave your home and all your belongings. Which one item would you take with you? Why? Pray for all those fleeing from South Sudan who have little or nothing because they have left everything behind.
December 15	Today's scripture reading reminds us to "rejoice always" because "God is near". God is near to the people of South Sudan through organizations like Friends in Solidarity and supporters like you. Today consider all the ways God has brought joy to your life and make a contribution that will bring joy to the South Sudanese people.

December 16	The Solidarity Agricultural Project in Riimenze is assisting the people of South Sudan to regain their agrarian skills after many years of civil war. Today be grateful for the food you have and thank God for farmers who grow your food.
December 17	Nearly 5 million people across South Sudan are severely food insecure with thousands already facing starvation due to famine. For each meal/snack you eat today contribute 25 cents to help these hungry people.
December 18	The Agriculture Project in Riimenze, Sudan helps families to grow enough food to feed themselves. Contribute 25 cents for each fruit and vegetable you eat today to help these families have nutritious food.
December 19	Today is International Solidarity Dayl During these past 18 days you have been growing in solidarity with the people of South Sudan. Look at the pictures on this brochure and give each person a name and say a prayer for them.
December 20	During this time of so much violence in South Sudan, the Solidarity team offers peace and reconciliation workshops at the Good Shepherd Peace Center. Today, be a peacemaker. Donate 25 cents each time you act nonviolently today.
, December 21	In April, in Rome, Pope Francis knelt down and kissed the feet of the government leaders. He begged them to work for peace. How will you be a peacemaker today?
December 22	Think about all you have learned about the people of South Sudan and the work of Friends in Solidarity. Share what you learned with someone else and ask them to put a donation in your container to help support their work.
December 23	For unto us a child is bornand his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah) Today, be peaceful as you wait for Christmas. Pray for Peace in South Sudan.
December 24	Count the money you have saved and send your gift to Friends in Solidarity. Merry Christmas!
