

Who we are

The initiative known as Solidarity with South Sudan born from the request of the Sudan Catholic Bishops' Conference (SCBC), who in 2008 invited the International Union of Superiors General (women religious) and the Union of Superiors General (men religious) to send a delegation to assess the needs of the country after many decades of civil war and to help the population to address critical educational, health and pastoral needs.

Currently there are 19 religious and 6 lay volunteers from 13 countries and 16 congregations in Solidarity communities in South Sudan. They minister in training institutions in Yambio and Wau, pastoral and agricultural programs in Riimenze and central administration and pastoral coordination in Juba, and in 7 Dioceses.

2020 has been a very complicated year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite several lock-downs, the activities continued in each area with the necessary security measures and thanks to the commitment of everyone: students, workers, volunteers and staff employed.

Almost **550** teachers have graduated since 2013

72% of Solidarity Teacher Training College graduates are currently employed





Only 14% of South Sudanese women are literate, **19%** of STTC graduates are women

Every year 2 graduates are sent to study for further study.

At the end of their studies they will join the STTC team as lecturers





The Catholic Health Training Institute has graduated ${\bf 154}$ registered nurses and ${\bf 73}$ midwives; At the end of 2021 there will be 40 new graduates





Of the **227** CHTI graduates, **83** are women

In recent years, CHTI trained 21% of the nurses and 28% of the midwives certified in South Sudan





83% of CHTI graduates are currently employed

Every year 2 graduates are sent for further study in order to join the CHTI team as tutors.









Since 2017, the Sustainable Agriculture Project Riimenze has conducted **29** radio talk shows to disseminate agricultural technical knowledge and nutritional information

66 community agricultural workshops have been conducted to growers in different locations





36% of workshops are aimes at women

24 permanent workers and 40 casual day laborers are employed by the project





Between 2019 and 2020, more than **62** tons of food were harvested.





On-going formation of clergy and religious: **140** participants in the workshops





Trauma healing workshops and training of facilitators, in response to the needs of a population affected by years of conflict: **2,135** participants

Peace-building workshops for healing, reconciliation and a lasting peace: **260** participants





Activities dedicated to supporting women. Empowerment workshops: **1,500** participants

Formation of small Christian communities, catechists and support for the Diocesan Pastoral Teams:
