

2020 revenues were boosted with the generous contributions of Bon Secours Mercy Health System, Wheaton Franciscans, Adrian Dominican Ministry Trust, Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers and several other congregations (45 women and 9 men) and other generous individuals and family foundations. There was a significant increase in contributions from religious congregations over 2019 due to outreach to leaders of those congregations. Our total income for 2020 was \$609,613. We anticipate similar revenues this year (2021)

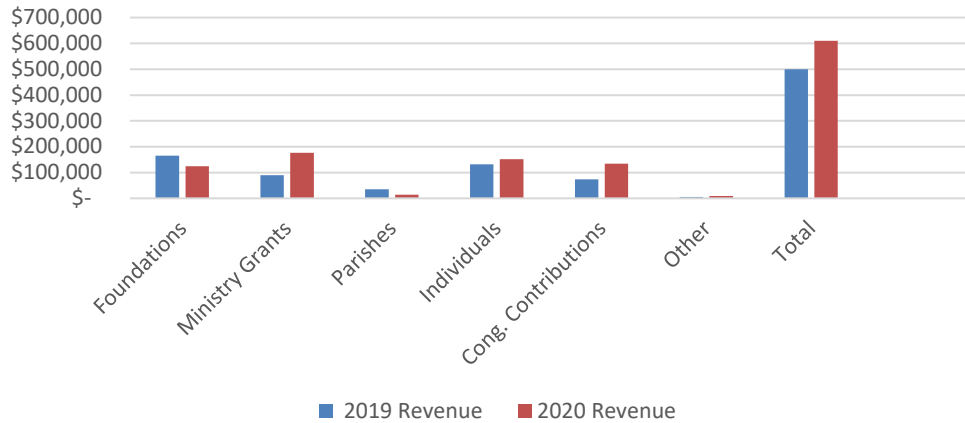
We have transferred \$415,000 to South Sudan as of October 1, 2021 and expect to send another \$80,000. Designated funding goes directly to South Sudan.

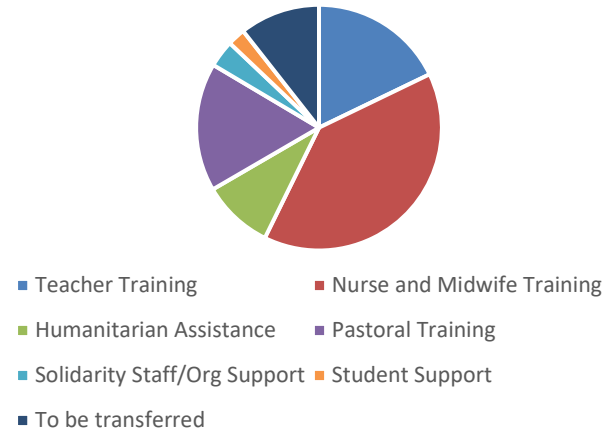

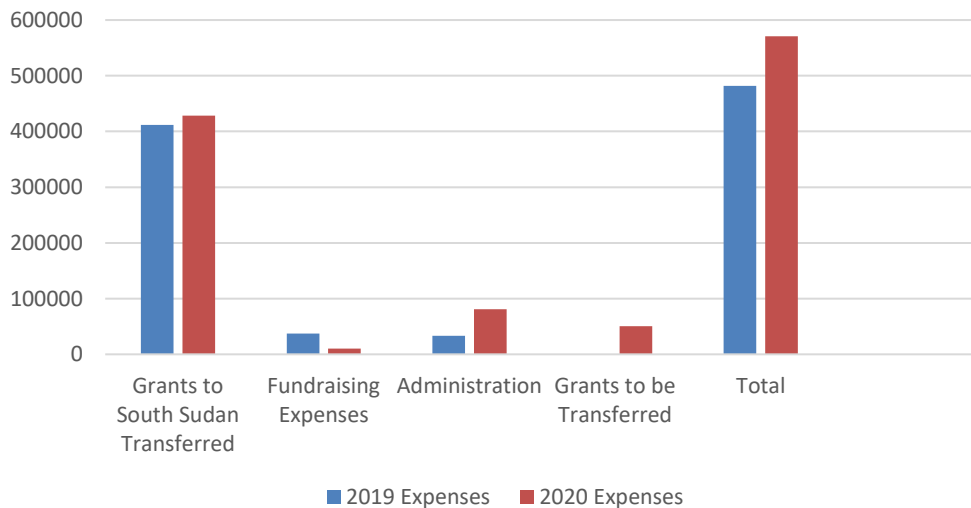
Friends in Solidarity Income 2019/2020

Solidarity with South Sudan institutions were closed for much of 2020 due to COVID 19. The Catholic Health Training Institute re-opened in October and graduated 41 registered nurses and midwives at the end of June 2021. A new group entered in late August

The Solidarity Teacher Training College re-opened in February 2021, just in time for a second shut down. Due to the fact that students were to take final exams by the end of the year, those on campus were allowed to remain. As of September there were 104 students on campus, 27 being women. The recent intake was 40% women. Recruiting women students is a priority for the STTC. 20 students graduated in October. The In-service program continued in Bor; 44 teachers graduated from the program and were certified in July 2021.

The Good Shepherd Peace Center was closed from March 2020 – October 2020 and again February to May 2021. In between they have hosted groups with all the COVID 19 protocols, and planned and facilitated retreats, renewal days for clergy and religious and youth. Friends in Solidarity and you, the donors, supported the Solidarity Pastoral Staff as they assumed responsibility for the management of the Center in April 2020. Program support has enabled the Center to continue operations during 2021.

Friends in Solidarity supported local congregations with COVID 19 grants, and local groups with humanitarian assistance; we provided teacher salaries in Riimenze, support for Solidarity staff and for graduates sent for further training with a view toward returning as Solidarity staff at the STTC.
