



Food for work support at the SAP-R demonstration farm

72 vulnerable families in Riimenze, benefiting from the Food for Work project under SAP-R, received a 3-hour training on the concept of sustainable agriculture from the livelihoods officer. In addition, some 25 persons, 15 women and 10 men, received a food items after completing 3-4 hours of manual labour at the SAP-R demonstration farm, Monday to Friday. The package included laundry soap, sugar, beans, biscuits, tea leaves and rice.

The okra has been harvested in abundance and is now ready to be sold. In the meantime, casual workers continue to weed sections of sukumawiki and cabbage at the SAP-R farm, where between 15 and 20 tonnes of crops are produced each year.

Care for the Elderly

The couple in the photo lives in Riimenze and is among the beneficiaries of the feeding programme for the elderly. They grow food such as sweet potatoes and cassava around their house and, because they are vulnerable, they cannot go far to cultivate. Neighbours help them with food when needed and fetch water for them every day. They also provide them with goods such as pots, mattresses, beds and food in case of robbery. If one of the neighbours leaves for the village, there is always one who stays at home for any needs. Lately they needed mosquito nets and the photo shows them on the day they received them. These elderly people heartily appreciate any help given to them.
