EMPOWERMENT FOR WOMEN IN BOR

Sister Jane Rose Onzia of the Solidarity Pastoral Staff conducted a training for the Empowerment of Women from December 11-15, 2023, in Bor in the Diocese of Malakal. 79 women from Saint Paul parish, from the Protection of Civilians (POC) Camp, and from various other religious groups registered for the program. The participants reported great satisfaction with the training, indicating that Sister Jane Rose's approach was unique from other seminars they have attended. They further indicated that they needed more of this kind of training, and that something similar should be offered for men as well. The training taught them how to take a constructive approach to conflict management that is designed to help to avoid situations that end in tragedy or violence. After living with conflict for so many years, the experience reported by many of the women is one of healing and relief. They have acquired skills that they can now share with their families and children and with other women and friends.





TRAINING FOR CATECHISTS
