Sorghum is one of the many crops cultivated as part of the Riimenze Sustainable Agriculture Project (SAP) at the demonstration farm site. This season we planted two feddan (an Egyptian unit of area equivalent to 1.038 acres) of sorghum, which was harvested, dried, packed, and stored.
